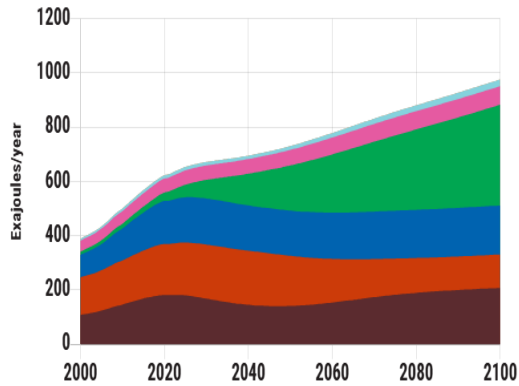

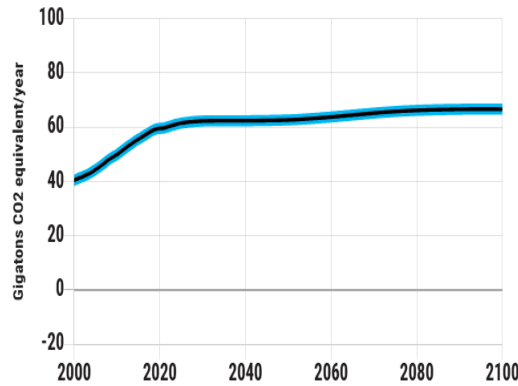


Global Sources of Primary Energy

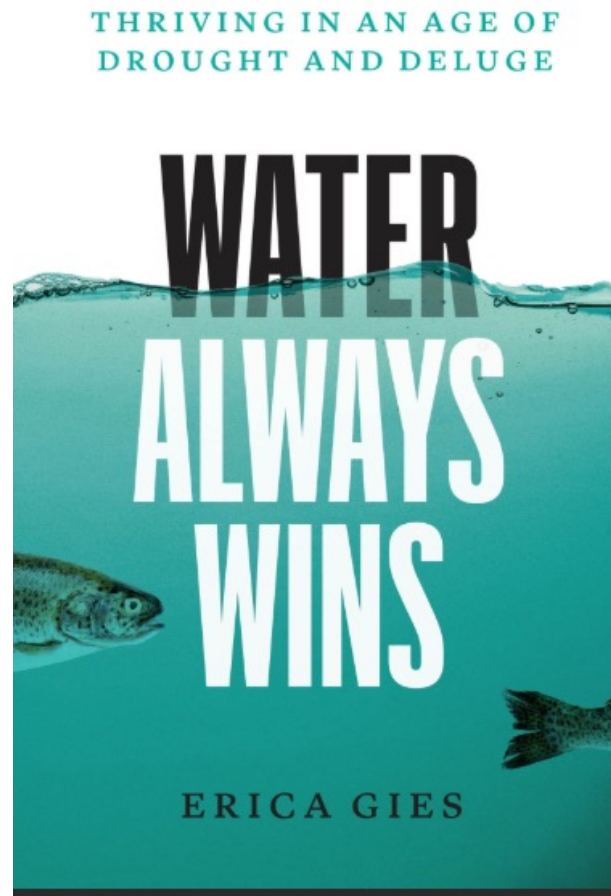
